

Three Respects in Action - Dolphin Slips



Reading is an essential skill for every child. It is the vital foundation of a child's learning and engagement in their school years and for life.




The Summer Reading Club encourages children and young people to discover great authors and illustrators of picture books, junior and young adult fiction and non-fiction.
