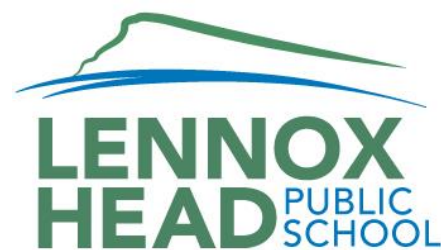

Australian Surfing Titles

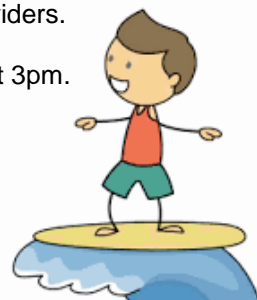
Lennox Ballina Boardriders are holding a massive Multi-Draw Raffle at Club Lennox on Sunday 18 November at 2pm.
