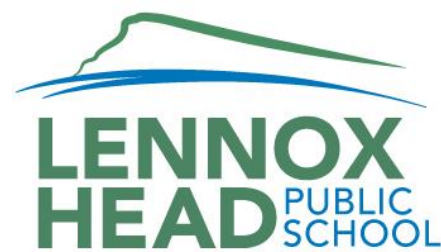

### Principal's Message

Once again it has been another super busy two weeks at our great school! We thoroughly enjoyed meeting all of the Kindergarten students for 2019 and their parents and we are very excited to welcome them to our school next year. Thanks to everyone involved in co-ordinating the orientation, including the Year 5 buddies. Everyone did an amazing job and you should all be very proud of yourselves.

The teaching staff are currently very busy using a new computing system to place children into classes for 2019. At this stage it looks like we will be forming 19 classes. A reminder that students are not being asked this year with which friends they may like to be placed. The system will work this out for us based on several items such as academic results, extra support and behaviour. In addition teachers will highlight which students possibly shouldn't be together and also those that should be. Once classes are formed we will not be able to move children. Change is something that we all have to deal with and it is a wonderful skill to form new friendships and connections in varied settings. Often as parents, we are too quick to jump in to try and fix things for our children. By allowing them to realise this is part of life, the skills they learn now will be invaluable for them as they become adults, when they need to manage change or handle adversity.

### Arrival at School

A reminder that students are not to be on the school site prior to the morning bell at 9am. There is no supervision provided until this time. We have had several children arriving well before 8:30am – which is a major safety concern for us as they are being left unsupervised. Please ensure that you have alternative arrangements in place so that your children stay safe. Before and after school care do operate on site every morning from 7am and again after school until 6pm.

In addition it has come to our attention that several children are going to the skate park before school, some from 7:30am – unsupervised. Children need to be supervised in this area. If your child has an accident here, it is a major concern. If you are allowing your children to skate before school, as it is great exercise, this is fine, however a reminder they need to be supervised. We have had several local residents contact us regarding their concerns with this.

### Late Arrival/Early Leavers

If your child arrives at school after 9:30am they must be signed in at the office with an adult. If you need to collect your child early from school please come to the office first to get a leave slip. You will then take it to the classroom to show the teacher and collect your child.

### Colour Fun-Run

Well done to everyone for their participation at our first ever school Colour Fun-Run last Friday. It was a warm afternoon but we were kept refreshed by the canteen and a big thanks to the P&C for the ice block donations for the students. It was a fantastic afternoon of fun and colour. Well done to all of the students for your fundraising efforts. I look forward to seeing the final tally once you have all collected your funds. A reminder all

prizes need to be ordered by the students by Saturday 24 November – the school does not do this for you.

Year 6 have had by all reports, a fantastic time at Lake Keepit this week on their excursion. I am sure when they arrive home later this evening they will have many great stories to share. No doubt they should all sleep well this weekend!

The Child Oral Health Service would like to remind parents and carers that teeth are important for normal development, function and health. They help children eat, speak and smile.

- Poor oral health can have adverse effects on growth, self esteem, nutrition and social behavior.
- Adult molars erupt behind the baby molars at about 6 years of age. Children need help to clean their teeth effectively
- Help your child to brush their teeth until age 8-10. Use a small amount of fluoride toothpaste, encourage children to spit out not rinse.
