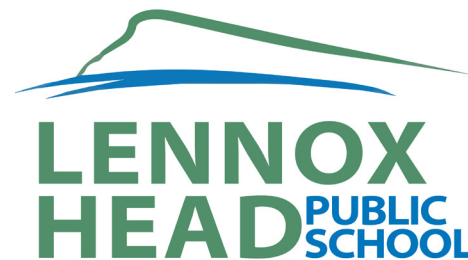

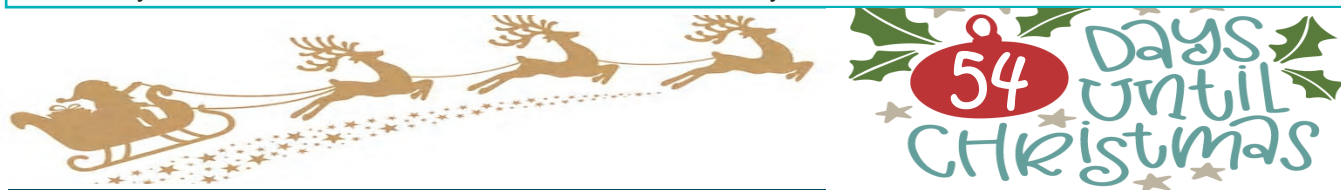

Safe on Social

On Monday 4 November we will be holding a special event just for parents in the school Library at 6pm. This will be presented by Safe On Social and will cover the importance of safety on the internet. We strongly encourage parents to attend.

Safe on Social Media Pty Ltd provide comprehensive Cyber Safety education, training and consulting in Australia and New Zealand. They are a certified training provider for the Australian Office of the eSafety Commissioner.

The topics covered in the student and parent/community presentations include but are not limited to:

- What you signed up for - they explain terms and conditions of use and what they mean
- Keeping personal information private
- Online stranger danger (online grooming)
- Ethics for when posting and sharing photos
- Child exploitation/pornography, sexting, sextortion and image-based abuse (age appropriate)
- Creating a positive digital footprint and curating your online image
- Cyber-bullying, online harassment, what it is and what to do
- Legal responsibilities, privacy settings and online gaming safety
- Strategies to build resilient digital citizens

They will also cover the most popular social media apps being used in your school, Snapchat, Instagram, YouTube, Facebook - what they are, how they work, security and privacy tips for safe usage.

Stage 2 and 3 students will participate in sessions throughout the school day. There is no cost for these sessions.

A reminder that planning for 2020 is well underway. If you know that you are not going to be enrolled at Lennox Head Public School next year, please let the office know as soon as possible.

Election of School Leaders for 2020

The Process:

- Eight Year 5 students (four boys and four girls) will be elected to represent our school as Captains, Vice Captains and Executive of the Student Representative Council for 2020.
- Nomination forms are to be completed and given to Mrs Langfield by Wednesday 13 November 2019.
- Elections: Round 1: If more than four boys and four girls are nominated, Year 5 and staff will elect four boys and four girls from the nominees on Tuesday 19 November 2019.
- The eight candidates will be announced at the whole school assembly on Monday 25 November 2019 at 2:10pm under the COLA.
- The eight candidates will speak at a special assembly on Monday 2 December 2019.
- Elections Round 2: Years 2-5 and staff will vote to elect the eight leaders on Monday 2 December 2019.
- The boy and girl with the most votes will be elected School Captains for the following year. The boy and girl with the next highest number of votes will be Vice Captains. The remaining four students will form the SRC Executive to be voted into roles at the first SRC meeting the following year. All students elected to positions are members of the SRC and are required to attend all meetings.
- The successful candidates will be announced at the Presentation Assembly on Friday 13 December. Students will be inducted in Early Term 1 2020.

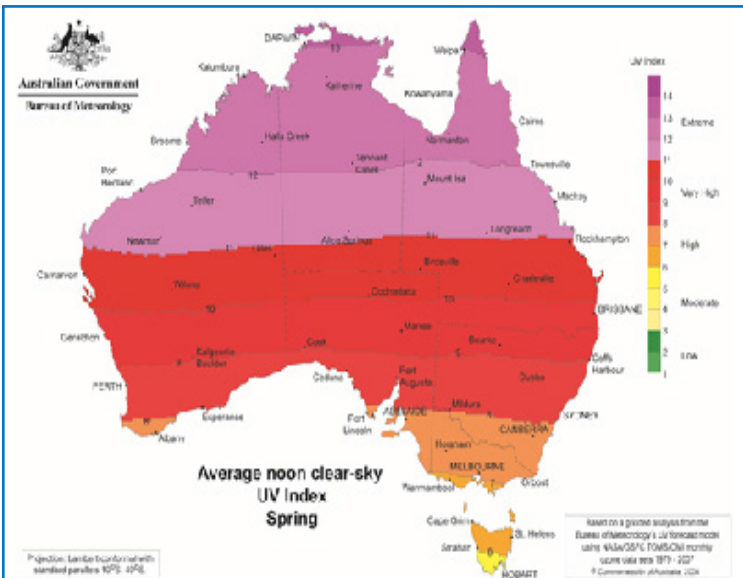
Please Note:

- A student will be ineligible for nomination if he/she has been to Follow Up 3 or more times this year.
- A student will be ineligible for nomination if he/she has been reported to the Principal for misbehaviour this year and has warranted a Principal's involvement in a parent interview.
- All eligible voters will be familiar with these guidelines.
- If at any stage during their time as Captain or Vice Captain, any elected student is in breach of these guidelines, they will be replaced by the student with the next highest number of votes, after two warnings. Parents will be informed of all warnings.

Election of Sporting House Leaders for 2020

The Process:

- Students who wish to nominate for House Captain or Vice Captain will give speeches at house meetings in early 2020. Students in the sporting house will then vote.
- Successful students will be announced at the conclusion of the house meetings.

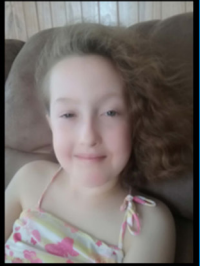
